


# Disability is not inability

# Be 'Safe to Swim' with our Water Skills Awards

The Water Skills Award booklet is more than a just a badge syllabus, it is a resource pack for teaching water confidence and swimming skills to people with disabilities. There have been minor changes as a response to feedback we have received from users, but after 20 years it was time for a major overhaul.

# What has stayed the same?

The basic principles of a 'swimmer' based system (we use the term swimmer to include everyone who is learning to swim). The swimmer chooses which of the 40 skills to work on and decides to what level they want to attain and when to incorporate a new skill. Points are earned for progress made and points mean badges!

There is still a comprehensive section for the carer / helper/ parent / teacher so they can provide the best instruction possible.

# What has changed?

The booklet is **FREE!** Just send an e-mail to the address overleaf and you will receive a copy by email.

Because it's free you can give it to everyone in your club who is learning to swim or helping someone else learn to swim.

The criteria for assessing many of the skills has been rationalized and is now more objective. For example, 'working with less support' has been changed to a time or a distance.

There is a completely new section. Several people told us that some of their swimmers are excluded from all badge systems, including NASCH, because of a profound disability. This was people in special schools at first, but more often




now, in voluntary clubs. Not wanting anyone to be excluded, we took advice from the carers and produced a list of skills for people with complex needs. They collect ticks and earn badges like everyone else.

Because the booklet is on the computer, you can add things to the skills list, if there is something you really need to work on. Now the booklet is distributed online, it can be easily kept up to date. If you find something could be improved, please let me know.
