
He will be greatly missed as evident from the condolences the NASCH committee have received.

His name has been synonymous with NASCH for as long as I can remember.

I remember speaking to Mike on the telephone a number of years ago and he sounded such a lovely man.

Although some of our senior members had only met him once or twice his name appeared on many occasions on NASCH newsletters and correspondence - he was well known to us all.

One of the most memorable and devoted NASCH characters - Mike O'Leary - has recently died, at the age of 83.

How will we remember Mike in NASCH? Mainly, I expect, as Camp Leader every May at Woodlarks Camp, a position he held for 25 years. As a nature lover and a committed volunteer with Disabled activities, the Woodlarks camps combined Mike's passions, and held a special place in his heart. On the Friday night before camp, Mike would travel to Woodlarks to supervise the Odiham Scouts who every year pitched some 15 to 20 canvas patrol tents. Using his Scouting background, Mike would make sure that every tent was put up properly and in the right place, to ensure that they remained dry and upright and could withstand the traditional Summer weather. This ensured that the camp started in the best possible shape and allowed Mike to welcome new Campers and to greet old friends. I'm sure many of you will fondly remember his mealtime addresses to the campers during the week, and his firm, but fair (!) direction of the fantastic volunteers.

As a young man, Mike initially volunteered with Riding for the Disabled, where he found that some members also went swimming. Being Mike, he followed this up and became a member of Portsmouth Penguins Swimming Club for the Disabled. This led him to attend a NASCH Conference at Stoke Mandeville in 1987 and the following year was elected onto the NASCH Committee.

The NASCH Conferences were held for many years at Stoke Mandeville, then in Derbyshire and finally in Hertfordshire and were enjoyed by all those who attended. At their peak, this was an opportunity for over 120 NASCH members to gather and receive updates about the charity, and for broader Disabled Sport discussions. Mike was responsible for booking the venue and the Speakers (many and varied). They were good times but sadly numbers attending declined and the Conferences were discontinued.

Aside from the Woodlarks camps and the Conferences, the other major annual fixture in the NASCH calendar was the Finals Galas. Again, Mike was an active presence by coordinating the many medals and trophies before they were presented to the Swimmers. He was meticulous in arranging them carefully on the Trophy table, so that they could be presented to the right people, for the right event, at the right time. In order to do this he had the unenviable task of ordering the medals and reminding Clubs to bring back the Trophies from the previous year.

Mike was a good friend to many in NASCH. His passionate commitment ensured that thousands of handicapped people across the UK benefited from Swimming, over decades. He always spoke passionately about NASCH and was a compelling advocate of Disabled Sport. We hope that you have warm memories of him, whether at camp, by the pool, or as part of the Committee; he will be sadly missed.


